

Job Class: Director, COE Accreditation and Assessment – Job ID# 14329

The College of Education:

With a commitment to excellence and recognized for exemplary academic programs and an outstanding faculty, the College of Education has 41 full time faculty members and approximately 600 undergraduate and 330 graduate and post-baccalaureate students. The College consists of three departments: Advanced Studies and Innovation, Kinesiology, and Teaching and Leading. The College is accredited by the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education (NCATE) and all educator preparation programs are approved by the Georgia Professional Standards Commission (GaPSC).

Position Description:

The Director will work collaboratively with the Associate Deans, Department Chairs, and Program Coordinators, overseeing the policies that create, foster and sustain excellence in initial and advanced certification programs, guiding the development of policies and processes to support initial and advanced certification programs; and ensuring the recruitment, matriculation, graduation, and induction of outstanding initial and advanced certification graduates.

Duties include coordination of initial certification program development, revision, and evaluation of programs, candidate recruitment, coordination of initial certification admissions and certification, edTPA leadership, quality assurance reporting (e.g., Georgia Title II, GaPSC PAAR, PEDS, SLO, SACS) coordination of strategic P-12 partnerships, and coordination of new teacher induction. This position also includes collecting, analyzing, and interpreting data for continuous improvement, validity and reliability. This Director will also provide leadership along with the Associate Deans and, Department Chairs, and Program Coordinators for all advanced program accreditation (CAEP, GaPSC, and CACREP). This Director will serve as the Secretary for the PEC's Assessment Committee. This is a 12-month, administrative appointment. Salary is commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Minimum Qualifications:

- Graduate Degree in one of the College program areas or a closely related field
- Experience directly related to the development, implementation, and evaluation of initial and advanced certification programs
- Established record of work with certification, accreditation, and public schools
- Strong leadership, collaboration, and supervisory skills
- Highly detailed and a self-starter
- Ability to work with diverse groups internal and external to the college including but not limited to administrators, faculty, staff, school and community leaders, Georgia Professional Standards Commission, Georgia Board of Regents, and the Georgia Department of Education
- Strong presentation and interpersonal skills
- Commitment to student and faculty diversity and multiculturalism
