The School of Education offers baccalaureate degrees in Art Education, Inclusive Early Childhood/Childhood Education, and Music Education as well as certification in adolescence education. It also offers master's degrees in Art Education, Educational Technology, Inclusive Adolescence Education, Inclusive Childhood Education, Inclusive Early Childhood Education, Literacy, Music Education, and TESOL. Students have a wide variety of field placement options in urban, suburban, and rural schools as well as in schools in China, England, Germany, Hungary, and Spain.

The School has 21 full-time and 40 part-time faculty; it currently enrolls 177 undergraduates and 218 graduate students. The pass-rate on the state certification exams for Nazareth students is among the highest in the state. Roughly half of the Fulbright Scholars from Nazareth have been students in the School of Education.

The ideal candidate will have a strong record as a teacher educator, administrative experience, experience with innovative programs, a strong commitment to the liberal arts and sciences, teaching experience in some segment of pre-K-12 education, and an entrepreneurial spirit and the aptitude for effective external relations.
