- Ensuring that the college prepares professionals for various roles in educational settings and community agencies;
- Collaboratively developing, refining, and implementing appropriate policies within the college;
- Assuring that the college's strategic objectives are met through robust assessment practices;
- Fostering a culture of reflective, evidence-based practice and inquiry within a diverse community of students, faculty, and staff;
- Maintaining accreditations with regional and national organizations;
- Providing leadership in the evaluation and professional development of department heads, faculty, and other personnel;
- Developing the college's budget and providing oversight for effective resource management;
- Assisting with fundraising and alumni activities;
- Ensuring that all programs in the college are properly administered and managed;
- Fostering a culture of transparent and consistent communication with faculty and staff in the college, as well as with university and community partners; and
- Performing other duties as assigned.

Position Context:

Valdosta State University is a comprehensive university within the University System of Georgia with a student enrollment of approximately 11,500 (81% Undergraduate, 19% Graduate). Over 400 faculty members teach courses at all levels (associate through doctoral) to students in over 100 majors in five colleges. Twenty-nine percent (29%) of undergraduate students enjoy on-campus living, while 40% of graduate students participate in online programs. Consisting of two campuses and 178 acres, VSU provides a unique atmosphere, a broad range of student activities, athletics, and cultural outreach to our community.
